

A Message from Fr. Jake

It's the season of Advent, preparing for Christ's coming in three ways, in the Incarnation of Christmas, at the end of time and the Last Judgment, and at our own individual judgment. We celebrate Advent where we prepare for that great day of Christmas. As the days grow darker and the nights grow longer, we long for the light of Christ to come. One good step to take to prepare for Christmas is embracing the Sacrament of Reconciliation to confess our sins and to receive the graces to live holier lives.

I encourage you to take advantage of this wonderful Sacrament during this Advent season. Below is an examination of conscience to help you reflect prayerfully on your thoughts, words, and deeds in order to identify any sins. Confession times and days are listed in the bulletin and on our website at www.olvjfk.com.

A Brief Examination of Conscience Based on the Ten Commandments

I am the Lord your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me. Have I treated people, events, or things as more important than God?

You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

Have my words, actively or passively, put down God, the Church, or people?

Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.

Do I go to Mass every Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) and on Holy Days of obligation? Do I avoid, when possible, work that impedes worship to God, joy for the Lord's Day, and proper relaxation of mind and body? Do I look for ways to spend time with family or in service on Sunday?

Honor your father and your mother.

Do I show my parents due respect? Do I seek to maintain good communication with my parents where possible? Do I criticize them for lacking skills I think they should have?

You shall not kill.

Have I harmed another through physical, verbal, or emotional means, including gossip or manipulation of any kind?

You shall not commit adultery.

Have I respected the physical and sexual dignity of others and of myself?

You shall not steal.

Have I taken or wasted time or resources that belonged to another?

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

Have I gossiped, told lies, or embellished stories at the expense of another?

You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse.

Have I honored my spouse with my full affection and exclusive love?

The Light is ON for You.

Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation

You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

Am I content with my own means and needs, or do I compare myself to others unnecessarily?
