

# Welcome to Our Lady of Victory Catholic Parish

### A Message from Fr. Jake....

The winter is definitely getting long, and as I write this column, there are two more opportunities for snow in the ten day forecast. Many parishioners have reached out to me in order to let me know that they are doing the best they can to get to Mass and other parish activities in light of this long, difficult winter. I know that everyone is doing the best they can to cope with the weather, illness, and the extreme circumstances that sometimes come into our lives. As a reminder, Catholics are not required to attend weekend Mass if they sincerely believe they are unable to attend because of the weather, personal health, or some unforeseen circumstance (i.e., having to take care of someone who is sick). Each person's conscience should be their guide in what they should do when facing bad weather, personal sickness, or an unforeseen circumstance. The Catholic Church does not ask people to do something impossible, so please follow your conscience in regards to Mass attendance.

People have asked me several times throughout this winter why I have not cancelled daily or weekend Mass. Since I live 125 ft. from the church, I cannot imagine I would cancel Mass unless I was extremely sick or I was stuck somewhere because of the weather. We had a daily Mass this winter where there were four people present, including me, but the number of participants in the Mass is not as important as having the Mass. Since the Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith, I want to make sure that I offer this Holy Sacrifice unless I am physically unable to be at church and I could not find a replacement. This means that the daily and weekend Masses will continue to happen in the future, even in case of bad weather. The close proximity of the priest to the church does not mean that a person should fill compelled to attend Mass. As I said above, people need to follow their conscience in regards to this Precept of the Catholic Church.

With all of this being said, there are also several Sunday night Masses offered here in the Quad Cities in case the weather improves on a Sunday. Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church in Bettendorf offers Mass at 5:00PM on Sunday nights. St. Paul the Apostle Catholic Church in Davenport offers Mass at 5:30PM on Sunday nights. Campus Ministry at St. Ambrose offers Mass at 6:30PM on Sunday nights during the academic year, September through May. I encourage anyone to take advantage of these additional options if they are unable to get out on a Saturday night or Sunday morning to come to Mass at OLV.

Parish activities will continue to be cancelled following the lead of JFK. If school is cancelled or evening activities are cancelled by JFK, parish activities will be cancelled as well. Since our parish activities require people to travel to the parish, we will follow the same recommendations about road conditions given to those who would attend school events.

Finally, I appreciate everyone being extra cautious in our parking lot this winter. We have tried our best to keep it clear, and with the help of Randy's Mowing, I believe that our parking lot has been much better than many of the businesses and churches in the area. However, it is far from perfect. The thawing and refreezing of the ice and snow is going to require caution in the weeks to the come. We will continue to monitor the parking lot, and we will work hard to try to keep it as clear as possible as we endure these final days of winter. However, please be careful!

Our Lady of Victory, please pray that we will have the necessary patience to endure these final days of winter!

#### Social Action

Because we are people of both faith and reason, it is appropriate and necessary for us to bring this essential truth about human life and dignity to the public square. We are called to practice Christ's commandment to "love one another" (Jn 13:34).



Whooping Cough, or pertussis, can be a serious disease for people of all ages but especially for babies. Whooping cough vaccines offer the best protection against this very contagious disease. Make sure you and your family are up to date with your whooping cough vaccines. Two vaccines in the United States help prevent whooping cough: DTaP and Tdap. These vaccines also provide protection against tetanus and diphtheria. Children younger than 7 years old get DTaP and older children, teens and adults get Tdap. The CDC recommends Whooping cough vaccines for people of all ages. The DTaP for young children should be given at 2. 4 and 6 months, 15 through 18 months and 4 through 6 years. The Tdap for preteens should be given 11 through 12 years. The Tdap for pregnant women should be given during the 27th and 36th week of each pregnancy. The Tdap for adults should be given anytime someone has never received one. Some states réquire a Tdap booster before entering secondary schools (lowa and Illinois do require the booster.) Most people who get the whooping cough vaccine do not have any serious problems with it. However, side effects can occur. Most side effects are mild, and do not affect daily activities. Please consult with your physician if you have any questions.
