This weekend, Divine Mercy Sunday, our parish will be celebrating First Communion at 1:30PM on Sunday afternoon. This special liturgy is always a wonderful event for our parish to celebrate and congratulate our First Communicants who have been preparing for this Sacrament and the Sacrament of Reconciliation throughout the past year. Please make sure to congratulate the forty-two families who have children receiving their First Communion this weekend. I would also ask that you continue to keep these children and their families in your prayers in the months to come. This celebration, along with Confirmation which was held two weeks ago, are blessed opportunities for these families, but we will need to continue to pray that the graces of these Sacraments grow and deepen in the lives of the recipients.

I also want to thank all of the Catechists, Teachers, and volunteers who helped in the formation of the Confirmandi's and First Communicants during this academic year. As you can see by the large number of students who received Sacraments this year, it took a tremendous amount of time and effort from many people to teach and form these student. Thank you to Mrs. Wemhoff, Mr. Steimle and everyone who helped prepare these students for the reception of Confirmation, First Communion, and First Reconciliation.

This Sunday also marks the end of our Treasure Renewal for this year. Letters were sent to over 1354 households within our parish. Of those households, 314 responded with the pledge cards. This means that we had a response of around 23%. I'm sincerely grateful for all responses, regardless of whether or not your household was able to increase your offertory amount. Thank you for your generous support of Our Lady of Victory! The parish is truly blessed by wonderful parishioners who are helping meet the financial needs of the parish. Furthermore, the updated contact information we received from a few parishioners was also appreciated. The parish is striving to find new ways to communicate to you the amazing things happening in our community, so if any of your contact information changes, please contact the parish or school offices to let us know so we can update our records.

As I mentioned over the last couple weeks, there will be a special Divine Mercy celebration at Sacred Heart Cathedral on Sunday afternoon at 2:00pm. The Divine Mercy Chaplet will be recited, and there will be an opportunity for confessions in order to complete the requirements for the plenary indulgence that is available on Divine Mercy Sunday. A mother of two children with Type I diabetes has started a local non-profit program to provide support to families struggling to cover health care expenses for their children. It is called Roell Inc. Assistance is available to families with children from infants to 21 years old living within a 40 mile radius of Durant, which includes most cities in Muscatine, Cedar and Scott counties. Parents of children with chronic illnesses such as diabetes sometimes have to look at all of the household expenses, including paying rent or buying groceries to decide what they can afford that month. Not to buy medicine is not an option according to Dorain Maag who started this organization. This struggle is not just an issue for the uninsured. Families above income guidelines for services are also left with few options to pay for medicine and supplies. Insurance deductibles, out of town travel to Dr. appointments, and other related costs affect families with insurance, often causing them to max out credit cards or take on second jobs. All families with or without insurance coverage, qualify for assistance from Roell Inc. There are no income guidelines to receive assistance. Families may fill out and return the provided form on the nonprofit's webpage, or may send a request to Roell through email or social media pages on Facebook and Twitter. Though the nonprofit has an age range for children needing medical support, Ms. Magg said, "it's not set in stone and families needing assistance should reach out." Through families needing assistance should reach out." monetary donations, rebates and coupons, Roell can help families get extra medical products to send to school, and provide gas cards or transportation services for appointments to specialists out of town as well as other needs.




