

A Message from Fr. Jake....

By the time you read this article, we will have held our annual Gala. As I write this column, everything is pointing to an amazing event so I am confident that we will have another successful Gala. I look forward to sharing some highlights from this event in the near future. However, I do want to take this opportunity to thank all of the volunteers who put so much effort into planning and executing this year's event. We are truly blessed in our parish to have such a dedicated group of volunteers that help and support this large event. We are doubly blessed to have so many people dedicated to supporting it! Again, I look forward to sharing more information about this event in the near future.

I also have three updates that I would like to share with the parish. The first update involves a land donation. Kwik Trip, Inc., which owns the Kwik Star gas station south of our property, decided to donate two additional lots of land to our parish. Therefore, our property now includes Lots 21 and 22 of Victory Acres (Parcel Nos. 1506-14 and 1506-15), which means that we now have a straight southern property line from Division Street over to Sturdevant Street. Through the work of volunteers, we have already begun the process of cleaning up this property, so we will be better able to maintain this land in the future. This was a generous gift to our parish, and I have, on behalf of the parish, thanked Kwik Trip, Inc. for it.

The second update involves the Meitler study. As you may remember, the Meitler Group was hired by the Assumption Foundation to help with a study that would look at how we are currently providing Catholic education in Scott County. This same study would also provide suggestions on how we can move forward in providing an outstanding Catholic education through the four elementary schools and one high school that serve students in Scott County. The finding of this study will be presented to the JFK faculty and staff along with leadership groups of the parish in the next few weeks as representatives of the committee that assisted the Meitler group go to each parish in our deanery. I look forward to hearing what insights Meitler provides in helping Catholic education thrive and grow in Scott County, and I will be providing more information about these findings in June.

The third update involves Vision 20/20. Our Lady of Victory is registered for the June event, and we will be preparing for this meeting in the coming month. As I said in the *Victory Voice*, Bishop Zinkula, through the Vision 20/20 initiative, wants to make sure that every parish is truly doing everything possible to evangelize and support our fellow Catholics and those who might want to join the Catholic faith. Therefore, if any parishioner has any ideas or thoughts about what we could do differently in our parish or what could be done differently in the diocese, please let me know before May 15 by calling the parish office or dropping me an email (greinerj@diodav.org).

Finally, I would ask that the parish continue to pray for our 8th graders who received the Sacrament of Confirmation three weeks ago, the 2nd graders who received their First Communion last week, and all of the students who will be finishing up school in the next five weeks. The end of the school year is always a busy time for the parish, so let us remember to hold each other in prayer during this hectic time of year.


