

A Message from Fr. Jake....

As we move into the middle of October, there are several event updates I want to share with the parish:

- The Rite of Welcoming will be held at the 9:00AM this weekend for those individuals who are in the RCIA program. Please keep these women and men in your prayers as they learn about the Catholic faith and consider joining the faith during the upcoming Easter season. There are several children and young adults who will not be present for this Rite because of scheduling conflicts, but please make sure to keep these young people in your prayers as well.
- Thank you to everyone who has already pledged to Annual Diocesan Appeal (ADA). As of this week, 86 OLV families have pledged \$37,000. This is a great start, and I am sure that this number will be increasing quickly in the next couple of weeks as we get returned envelopes over to the diocese for processing. If you have not returned a pledge envelope as of yet, it can either go in the offertory, or you can mail the pledge envelope directly to the diocese. The diocesan website, www.davenportdiocese.org, also has the link if you would like to give electronically to this campaign. Every donation helps, so thank you very much for your support
- The Harvest Day Dinner for the Our Lady of Victory Foundation was held on Sunday, September 29th. At this annual celebration, the Board members for the OLV Foundation were able to thank its donors for their generous support, which resulted in the Foundation being able to give the parish and its ministries \$45,000 to use for this fiscal year. The latter is the largest gift ever given by the Foundation, so this additional financial support will make a huge difference in the coming year. The Board also shared the good news that the endowment has reached its \$1,000,000 goal through the gifts shared in the Legacy Campaign. I want to personally thank once again all of the donors to the Foundation who made this milestone possible. I should also mention that the Foundation would not have happened without the leadership of previous Pastors here at OLV. I am truly blessed to have been able to follow Fr. Martin, Mr. Meyer, Fr. Kaska, and Msgr. Parizek.
- As the flood water goes down again (hopefully to stay), I wanted to give the parish an update on how their donations for flood relief were spent over the last few months. You donated a total of \$5,657.52 to help flood victims at the beginning of the summer. A total of \$411.09 was spent on cleaning supplies and others items needed by flood victims. A lump sum of \$2,088.91 was given to Habitat for Humanity to assist in the rebuilding of flood damaged homes and businesses throughout Davenport. The rest of the donations, \$3,057.52, was used to pay for housing for flood victims while they were fixing their homes and apartments. Thank you for your amazing support, and many of the flood victims told me that they do not know how they could have gotten through these events without your prayers and financial support.
- This weekend is the conclusion of the special presentation on Catholic Social Teaching. I know that a lot of effort and time went into planning these events, so I want to thank everyone who made these two presentations possible. Please stay tuned for more events in regards to Catholic Social Teaching here in our parish.



Are you prepared to avoid the flu this season? Here are some facts:

Getting a flu shot is the first and most important step in protecting yourself and your family against seasonal flu.

Seasonal flu activity begins to increase in October. Everyone 6 months and older should receive a flu shot every flu season. Annual flu vaccinations are needed as the flu virus is constantly changing. Most healthy adults are contagious 1 day prior to symptoms and 5-7 days after symptoms are present. Children and those with weakened immune systems can be contagious even longer.

Trunk or Treat

What room does a ghost not need? (A living room!) Invite your friends and family to the 4:30 Mass on Saturday October 26 with Trunk or Treating following the Mass in the OLV parking lot. Please park on the south side of the parking lot if participating in Trunk or Treat.

What is "Trunk or Treat"? It is where the adults decorate their cars in the spirit of the holiday and have "treats" to pass out to children participating. Children dress in family friendly costumes and then go car to car instead of house to house and "Trunk or Treat."

"Stepping On" Fall Prevention

Are you fearful of falling? Do you find yourself using the

armrests to arise from chairs? Is it difficult for you to move throughout your house or walk outside? Háve you had a fall in the past? If you are 60 or older and answered yes to any of these questions, you may benefit from a comprehensive fall risk reduction program. There are many risk factors that contribute to falling including leg weakness, poor balance, poor vision, medications, and home environment. Studies show that attending a comprehensive class for fall risk reduction will lower your risk of falling.

Genesis offers a program called "Stepping On" where you'll learn exercises and strategies to help prevent you from falling. The workshop is offered twice per year.
