I want to begin by thanking everyone who helped with organizing and executing the Ministry Fair this weekend. This event is a tremendous opportunity for parishioners to find out about the different ministries here at our parish. I hope and pray that many parishioners can discover a ministry that can help them grow in their own faith as they serve others. We are blessed with many different ministry opportunities here at OLV, so if you need some time to think and pray about a commitment, no problem. You can always contact the parish office for more details about any ministry here at OLV. Furthermore, many of the ministries we offer here at OLV are ongoing throughout the year, so there is no deadline for becoming involved. Whatever additional support parishioners provide, enables more ministry to happen here at the parish. Thanks again to everyone who made this event happen!

This time of year is also an important time for many of our older parishioners in the parish. With the start of the Medicare enrollment period on October 15th, many parishioners will be looking at the possibility of changing their insurance plan for the upcoming year. If you need help with selecting a health insurance carrier or have questions about your current plan, SHIIP (Senior Health Insurance Information Program) Counselors are in the Quad Cities area to help you make a decision in regards to your Medicare insurance coverage. SHIIP is a State of lowa program that trains volunteers to help people navigate Medicare and Medicaid. I have been personally impressed by the professionalism and knowledge of the SHIIP counselors that I have interacted with over my time here at OLV, so I believe that they are a great resource to any senior who has questions about their healthcare. Anyone interested in talking with a SHIIP volunteer just has to call one of the numbers below, and you can schedule a time for them to meet with you to talk about your situation. Who is at highest risk of health complications if they get the flu?

- Pregnant women
- People younger than 3 and older than 65
- Caretakers and family members of high risk populations
- People with medical conditions such as diabetes, lung disease, and asthma

A yearly flu shot is the best way to prevent influenza as it allows your body to build up antibodies against the infection over time (may take up to 2 weeks). The flu vaccine is safe and suggested for most people, including infants and seniors.

Flu spreads through droplets in coughs and sneezes. Less commonly the flu can be spread through touching a surface contaminated with the virus and then touching your hands, mouth, eyes or nose.






