

Cultivating Our Future began in early 2020 to grow our parish, improve our facilities, and provide a quality learning environment for students. As of September 1, over \$1.3 million in gifts and pledges have been received. Donations to this extraordinary effort allowed us to pay all campaign expenses without spending operating dollars, plus...

- Install a state-of-the-art heating, air conditioning, and ventilation system in our school building.
- Invest in our worship facility with electrical upgrades, a new sound system, replacement of essential heating/cooling components, ultraviolet technology to improve ventilation, and a professional camera system to record and live-stream events inside our church.
