- Dry goods: oatmeal, macaroni and cheese, dried beans, rice and other whole grains, pasta, boxed dry soup, gluten free pasta
- Individually packaged snacks: boxes of raisins, granola bars, protein bars, fruit snacks, juices, gluten free granola bars
- Food not requiring kitchen preparation: nuts and seeds, dried fruits, granola, nut butters, cereal, canned vegetables, applesauce, and pudding packs


