

# Welcome to Our Lady of Victory Catholic Parish

### A Message from Abbey Heinrichs, Youth Minister......

We are now in the third week of Advent. The third week of waiting for the birth of Jesus, of preparing for Christ to come again. This week in particular, we notice our joy continuing to grow as we approach Christmas day. We reflect on the joy the Shepherds must have felt as they were journeying toward Jesus.

I have been anticipating this Advent season since being in Bethlehem earlier this year on my Holy Land Pilgrimage. I remember standing in the holy sites, very aware that Advent would never be the same for me, that I had now experienced a closeness to Jesus and the joy of Christmas that I hadn't before.

On June 1st of this year, I and 36 other Catholic young adults stood in the Shepherd's Field Chapel just east of Bethlehem singing carols and sharing the joy the shepherds must have felt knowing of Jesus's birth. I remember walking out of the chapel looking towards the site of the Nativity, the actual location we believe to be where Jesus was born, overwhelmed with a joy that brought me to tears. God's grace was so abundant in that place.

We then stood in a long line, shoulder to shoulder, with security rushing us through the church as we attempted to claim a moment to reflect in the place of the nativity. Surrounded by the gold structures built over the site and the hustle of all of the pilgrims also trying to steal a moment, I didn't expect to feel anything. I noticed myself starting to feel some frustration and fear that this moment that I had so highly anticipated would pass by with little impact, as I had just a moment to snap a quick picture and move along. When it was my turn to be quite literally pushed into the cave where Jesus was born and claim about 20 seconds to try and take in as much as I could with my eyes and my heart, I felt this nudge to reflect on the hustle and chaos Mary and Joseph must have experienced trying to find a place to welcome Jesus into the world. I'm sure the moments leading up to His birth were nothing short of frustration and fear. God chose to become human and be born into a chaotic and broken world for us ken world for us.

I walked out of the cave, my eyes welling with tears, overcome with joy and peace. I'm sure just a glimpse of the joy and peace Jesus's birth brought to Mary and Joseph in that moment. Just a glimpse of the joy and peace God desires for us to live in every day.

With Advent quickly coming to an end and Christmas approaching, I challenge you all to take the next week to reflect on what this season of waiting means for you. To ask Jesus why He forces us to wait. I challenge you to pray for

the joy of Christmas for yourself and your loved ones.

Lastly, as I reflect on my time in the Holy Land, I can't help but feel sorrow and fear for the people in Israel and Palestine. This week, I beg you to pray for all of the families being affected by the war. I pray specifically for the Israeli family that welcomed me into their home to share a meal during my time in Bethlehem.

"Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. Give thanks in all circumstances... ~1Thessalonians 5:16-18

URGENT APPEAL: HELP STOCK OURNEW FOOD PANTRY! This is a great outreach to our community that might go without necessary needs. A suggestion list of needed items is below. ALL items need to be placed in the "box" at the main entrance of church. NO Fresh fruit or expired items. Please do NOT put items directly into the outdoor <u>pantry box</u>. Some suggested items are:

- Dry goods: oatmeal, macaroni and cheese, dried beans, rice and other whole grains, pasta, boxed dry soup, gluten free pasta,
- Individually packaged snacks: boxes of raisins, granola bars, protein bars, fruit snacks, juices, gluten free granola bars
- Food not requiring kitchen preparation: nuts and seeds, dried fruits, granola, nut butters, cereal, canned vegetables, applesauce, and pudding packs
- Personal hygiene items: shampoo/conditioner, deodorant, soap, toothpaste/toothbrushes, feminine hygiene products, NO RAZORS please
- Baby wipes and diapers


