HEALTH MINISTRY AND WELLNESS TEAM UPDATE

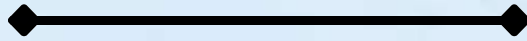

This past year has been a truly active and rewarding one for our Health Ministry and Wellness teams. Together, we've worked to support the physical, emotional, and spiritual well-being of our parish community through a wide variety of programs and outreach efforts.

We began with Life Inventory, a thoughtful discussion on the many practical steps to consider as we age. We also offered life-saving skills training, including CPR, AED, and Stop the Bleed, led by local EMTs. Our teams supported parish events such as the Spring Fling Tea Party, and we hosted a successful book sale, with proceeds funding two \$500 scholarships for parishioners pursuing studies in health and wellness. In addition, we led two GriefShare sessions, assisted with blood pressure clinics, continued Nourish—OLV's caregiver support group—and launched our very first Medicare informational meeting. We also continued the comforting work of the Prayer Shawl Ministry.

Beyond programs, our ministry has been present with parishioners in their times of need. We visited the sick in hospitals, homes, and nursing facilities; made countless phone calls to assist with health care decisions; attended visitations and funerals to say our final goodbyes; and delivered casseroles and Holy Communion to those unable to attend Mass.

Through all these efforts, we strive to live out Christ's call to care for one another in body, mind, and spirit.

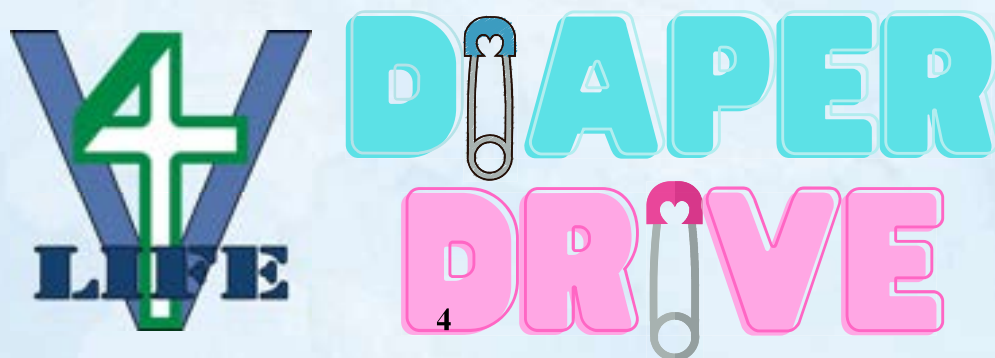


VICTORY 4 LIFE

ADULT FAITH FORMATION

This summer Adult Faith Formation and Victory 4 Life partnered to provide the study: Theology of the Body: God's Master Plan for your Life. Over 20 individuals signed up to participate in this study. You may be asking yourself "what is Theology of the Body?"

The Theology of the Body (TOB) is Pope John Paul II's teaching about the meaning of being human, focusing on how the human body is a "language" that reveals spiritual and divine truths about God's plan for life, love, and relationships. It asserts that humans are a unity of body and soul, created in God's image, and are inherently designed for a purpose of loving communion with God and others. TOB explores fundamental questions about existence, the original unity of humanity before the fall, and how Jesus's life, death, and resurrection restore this unity, enabling people to live in accordance with God's loving purpose.

During this study we had wonderful discussions. One comment that was most commonly said was: "I wish I had the opportunity to learn about this earlier."

Jerry G. had this to say about the study: **Theology of the Body is truly a gift given to the Catholic faithful worldwide from Saint John Paul II. Quite simply, Theology of the Body illustrates God's perfect design for humanity as it relates to one's physical being and the total giving of one's self to another in the one flesh union which occurs during a sacramental marriage of one man and one woman. TOB teaches about authentic love, a love that was demonstrated quite literally by Jesus to his church - we, the members of his church. John Paul II teaches that the foundational aspects of authentic love is a love demonstrated by a free, total, faithful and fruitful giving of oneself in the context of marriage. And with that, a respect for the dignity of life.**

The world's culture today, and the prevailing secular worldview is oftentimes opposed to the tenets of Theology of the Body. The secular mindset is characterized by a "whatever makes you happy" approach to life and relationships. And in that mindset, the dignity of life, and desiring the best for others, is lost. Theology of the Body helps re-center dignity for life.



And another couple had to say about participating in this study:

Theology of the Body gave us a new perspective on our relationship with God and why we are loved by God. It gave us a better understanding of how sex in a marriage can bring us closer to God and better explains why sex outside of marriage is a detriment to our relationship with God.

There was such a positive response from those that participated in TOB that the conversation is continuing. A small group is talking about how to bring TOB to more people. Small Steps, Big Results ~ Inspired by The Little Flower

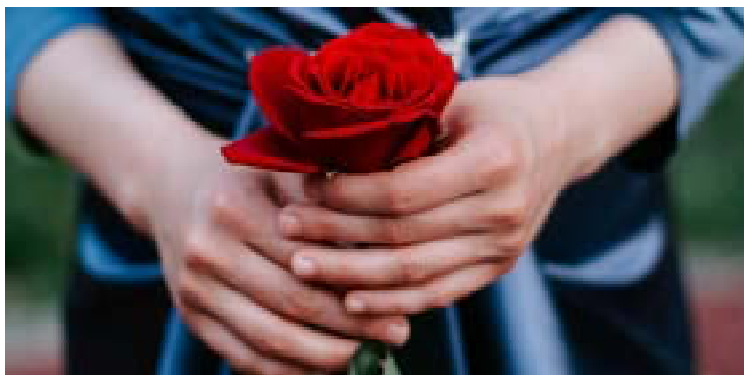

This year, our Religious Education classes and Family Faith Formation programs began on October 1st—the Memorial of Saint Thérèse of Lisieux. Inspired by this beautiful coincidence, we have chosen to look to St. Thérèse for guidance and to ask for her prayers throughout the year ahead for our catechists, staff, students, and families. We warmly invite all parishioners and friends of Our Lady of Victory to join us in this prayerful effort—through May and beyond!

It is fantastic to take a look at the lives of Saints, especially the ones who gave us their writings where they shared their love for Christ Jesus, as well as their personal experience with struggles in prayer life, sinfulness and living in this world with many distractions to pull us away from Christ. In her autobiography, *The Story of a Soul*, Thérèse said, “We live in an age of inventions.” She was referring to Alexander Graham Bell’s telephone and Thomas Edison’s record player, as well as the introduction of an electric light bulb. At a young age, Thérèse, also known as ‘The Little Flower’, entered into religious life at a convent becoming a Carmelite. During those years she devoted herself to what she came to call her “little way” to holiness and followed closely what we find in **Hebrews 13:14-16**. She led a simple and quiet life of prayer, despite her growing up in the age of inventions and many distractions in the world. Her heart was filled with love and trust in God until she departed from this life at the age of 24.

Today, there are a great many more inventions and distractions and it can be hard to focus, or re-focus on simple, quiet and devoted time for prayer. It can be done, though, and it is so important, because as Saint Thérèse reminds us, “The world is thy ship and not thy home.” This is not a permanent home for us and eternal life in Heaven with Christ is our ultimate goal. If we are a parent, a spouse, a pastor of souls: We have a great calling to help aid the faithful in reaching this goal. Fostering a strong prayer life by creating space, time and leading by example is a great way to do this. As The Little Flower shares with us, “For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven,

As The Little Flower shares with us, “For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy.” We can and should turn to Christ in prayer at all times and we can offer Him all of our “actions of this day”, as she wrote in her Morning Prayer. No matter how small the suffering we may offer up, or how little the voice that may utter the impromptu prayer, fruitfulness will come and intimacy with Jesus will flourish! The ‘little way’, small actions and young disciples can really make a large impact on our personal relationship with Jesus and on those around us.



“God invites us into a relationship with Him that is both personal and communal. He speaks to us through His Son, Jesus Christ, the Word-made-flesh. Prayer is our response to God who is already speaking or, better yet, revealing Himself to us. Therefore, prayer is not merely an exchange of words, but it engages the whole person in a relationship with God the Father, through the Son, and in the Holy Spirit.” (USCCB) This month, I would like to extend an invitation to each of our parishioners to take a little time to look at and utilize an amazing digital resource provided to us by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops: <https://www.usccb.org/catholic-prayers>

LIVING OUR MISSION. The Eucharistic liturgy is the source and summit of our parish life. In addition to Mass, we offer blessings for expectant parents, Stations of the Cross, weekly Holy Hour, remembrance of our loved ones on All Souls Day, the rosary and numerous prayer services that inspire our souls and bring us closer to the Lord.

Firmly committed to lifelong learning we offer small group studies, Christian Experience Weekends, Youth + Family Engagement, TMIY, plus various health and wellness workshops. JFK School was home to 401 K-8 students, while our youth ministry and faith formation programs were beehives of activity where students explored Catholic beliefs and practices.

We enable our members to grow as one family with quality activities like the parish picnic, Spring Fling luncheon, Trunk or Treat, fellowship for single adults and golden-agers, Euchre and Parish Appreciation nights, Thanksgiving dinner, plus care packages for college students preparing for finals.

We answered the call to help others with prayer shawls, Kids Against Hunger meal packaging, Christmas gifts for nursing homes and children, blankets and warm clothing for the homeless, diapers and baby wipes for young parents, bi-monthly Hunger Ministry Meals, and the Little Food Pantry.

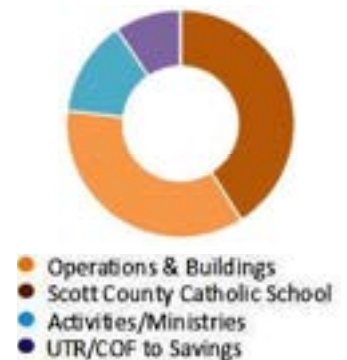

Notes & Highlights

- A \$170,000 project to replace school playground equipment was funded by an SCRA grant, federal COVID relief grant, a distribution from the OLV Foundation and miscellaneous donations.
- Our parish share from the diocesan *Upon This Rock* campaign equals 20% of every dollar paid by OLV members to this fund drive. As previously determined, parish share dollars are restricted for future capital improvement projects.
- A \$60,000 payment was applied to the mortgage at QC Bank & Trust using residual funds from the *Cultivating Our Future* campaign. Mortgage balance is \$110,000 and \$30,682 remains in the campaign account. Earnings on this investment are higher than interest paid on the mortgage.

OUR LADY OF VICTORY LADIES COUNCIL

The Ladies Council has been part of Our Lady of Victory since the parish began. All women of the parish are members, and together we provide service, support, and community through parish events, outreach ministries, and the work of our Ladies Circles.

Active Circles

- St. Elizabeth Seton Circle coordinates Social Sundays with donuts after Mass, organizes the Wishing Well at Christmas for nursing home residents, and contributes to the Bazaar with pies and baked goods.
- St. Anne's Circle welcomes and farewells priests with receptions, stocks the OLV Little Food Pantry, hosts Euchre Night and Bingo, and runs the Candy Booth at the Bazaar.
- Community of Saints Circle is a prayer network of 50+ members who lift up parish and community needs through a phone tree ministry.
- Queen of Heaven Circle provides funeral luncheons, supports the Angel Blanket ministry, contributes to parish liturgical needs, and sponsors outreach such as Friendly House, Café on Vine, and One Eighty. They also run the Bazaar raffle.

Council-Wide Events & Outreach

The Ladies Council raises funds through the annual Rummage Sale, Bazaar, and Gently Used Christmas Sale. Proceeds support parish needs and local charities including St. Anthony's Window, Women's Choice Center, Pregnancy Resources, Veterans Outreach, and Davenport Public Library. We also host Social Saturdays and welcome new parishioners with a wine-and-cheese reception.

Parish & School Support

Over the years, the Council has provided major improvements for the parish and John F. Kennedy School, including:

- New roof for the gym and rectory, new Pella windows and doors
- Over \$100,000 raised to retire parish debt
- \$25,000 toward the "Cultivating Our Future" campaign
- Repairs to stained glass windows (\$30,000)
- Furniture, appliances, altar needs, and kitchen supplies
- Support for youth, Knights of Columbus, and parish celebrations
- Coming soon: a new lighted sign at the rectory and a new tarp for the JFK gym

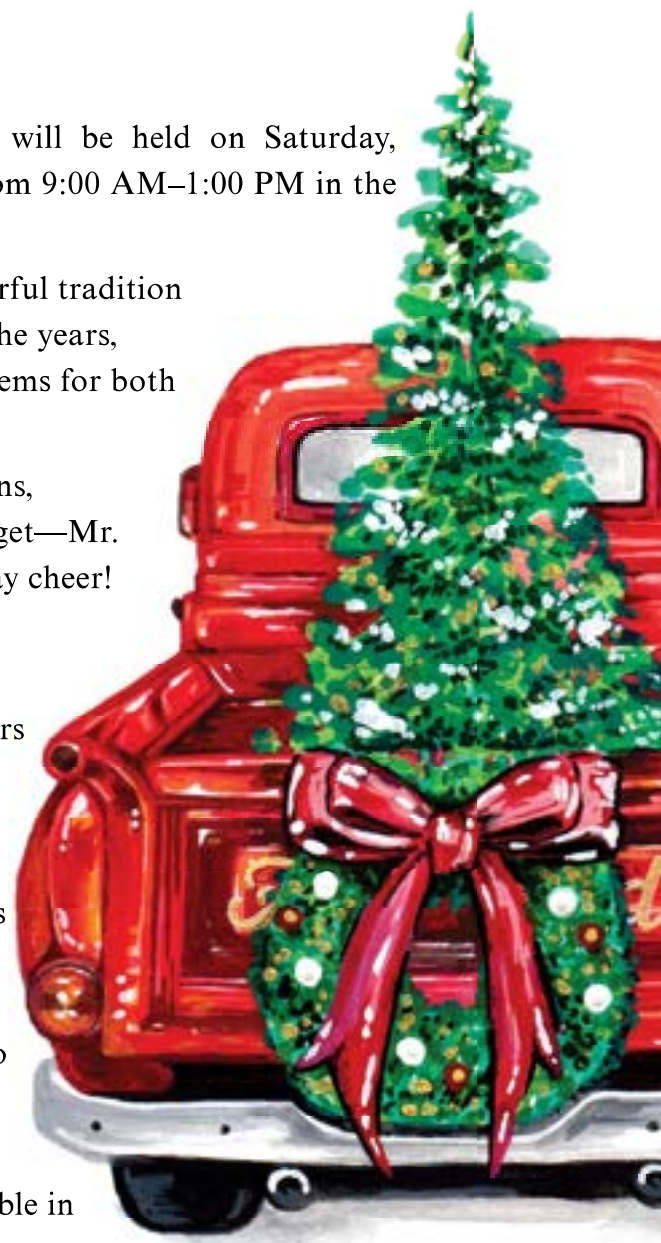
