# Principal's Report to the Board of Education September 1, 2015

## Facilitator of Faith Community:

- 1. With the redecoration of the cafeteria, a much larger crucifix has been secured and is awaiting repair. It is believed that this crucifix may have been the original from when Masses used to be in the cafeteria and gym area before the church was built.
- 2. The planning for the school Mass celebrated by Bishop Amos is underway. Planning for Catechetical Sunday Mass has also begun.
- 3. Many teachers are planning on attending a regional catechetical training to be held at St. Paul's this year. Kelly Poster, Julie Bauer, and Elisha Kubalsky will be presenters.
- 4. Jason Everet, national speaker for youth and parents regarding chastity, has been confirmed for our diocese. He will be at OLV on April 28th for parents and youth, at AHS on the 28th for 9-12, and at AHS on the 29th for grades 7-8.

## Leadership of School Culture and Instruction:

- 1. Professional Development:
  - a. We are working on the overview of our PD for the year. Included will be the following:
    - i. 95 Percent Group material usage for K-5 and consortium for Kindergarten and first grade teachers, literacy coaches, and administration
    - ii. ELA materials implementation
    - iii. I-Ready training and implementation
    - iv. ASCD online courses with four options available:
      - 1. Student motivation
      - 2. Formative assessment
      - 3. Reading comprehension
      - 4. Differentiated instruction
    - v. Title IIA funding was approved for i and iv above
- 2. Interviews are complete for the additional 3/7 paraeducator position. Generating a pool of candidates was time consuming. Once fully staffed, we can better prepare a schedule that provides the additional math help for grades 3-5 through one to one or small group pull out sessions or extra adult help within the classroom during regular math instruction.
- 3. The Iowa Department of Education approved the Next Generation Science Standards. Implementation guidelines and timelines will be forthcoming.

## Managerial Leadership:

- 1. Having just finished the summer reports for the Department of Education, it is now time for the fall reports. Various reports are due about every 15 days from September through October 31st. We will also be starting our National Catholic Educational Association and diocesan reporting soon.
- 2. We conducted the third round of interviews for an evening custodian yesterday. Through the first two rounds of eight interviews, the position was offered three times, and applicants declined. Filling our non-certified staff positions is just as hard, if not even harder, than our certified staff (teachers).
- 3. Nicole Baier and Beth Ehrecke have been hired for the kitchen staff. We had three applicants, and the position was turned down once.

We continued throughout August to turn families, including those with multiple children, away without space in kindergarten.

6. JFK will have an on-site audit/review of the lunch program by a Department of Education representative this year. Typically, these are scheduled every other year, but they did not conduct it last year.

## Public Relations Leadership:

- 1. We have three staff liaisons for Mock Trial, and Michael Motto, parent of students at JFK, has agreed to coach, although his time is somewhat limited. His uncle has also agreed to help but also has limited time.
- 2. The two adults per car rule for parent drivers on field trips has been rescinded by the diocese. At least one adult in a vehicle, however, must have a background check and be Virtus trained. Moving further than the diocese is willing to at this time, we will no longer allow chaperones/drivers with younger children in tow.

## Leadership in Diocesan/Parish Context:

- 1. I attended the Diocesan Board of Education meeting. Many policies received their first reading. The National Standards for Effective Catholic Schools were approved for the diocese in their first reading. The strategic plan for education was also approved on a first reading with changes. The feedback that expressed concern had to do with funding, a few specific numbers and dates, the ability to actually carry it out, and the fact that various parts of a diocesan plan will sound top-down.
- 2. I attended the August Finance Council meeting:
  - a. A motion was made to make an \$80,000 payment toward the building debt sometime during this fiscal year. However, this payment will also be considered in light of the best fiscal move to make when the \$225,000 bill for the roof comes due, and a loan is needed.

- b. Finance Council recommended that OLV work with the Cunneen company to conduct an envelope giving campaign.
- 3. I attended the August parish council meeting. Unofficial, but unanimous, approval was given to the Cunneen campaign, and a formal vote will be taken after the stewardship committee has a chance to meet and discuss the Cunneen campaign.
- 4. Julie Delaney from St. Paul's and I will be presenting at the Diocese of Sioux City's Ministries Conference in September. I will be sharing our story regarding ELA time, our ELA audit, and our focus on student engagement and total participation techniques.
